## Mosquito Season is Here

Please take a moment to walk your property and rid it of standing water. Standing water can turn into stagnant water that has potential to allow mosquitoes to breed. Very little water is necessary for mosquito breeding.

Areas that cannot be rendered free of stagnant water treat with a larvicide which can be purchased at local garden and hardware stores. Identify and treat water now. This will help control areas that may breed mosquitoes.
