In Remembrance



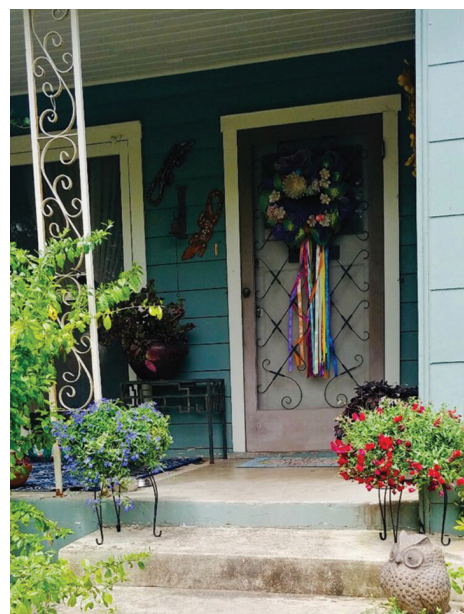

CPS Energy: Night Security Lighting vs Street Lighting

At last year's annual THNA meeting, Officer Tudor reminded residents that a major deterrent in crime is adequate lighting. CPS Energy provides two options to residents.

Any citizen may request an additional streetlight by contacting the City of San Antonio customer service at 311. The COSA provides the following information: "The 311 operator will ask the information and open a streetlight request in a tracking system. The citizen will receive a tracking number from the operator. This number enables the person to track the request with the Development Services Department (DSD). DSD retrieves the new requests daily.

The DSD staff will conduct a preliminary investigation. The applicant will be sent a letter notifying them that the

street light is warranted or not. If the streetlight is warranted and there is a recorded easement for the connection of the streetlight then CPS Energy will begin their process for the installation



otherwise the affected resident may be required to provide an electric easement to allow CPS Energy to install their infrastructure."

It is important to note the difference between street lighting and night security lighting.

Street lighting is maintained by the COSA and the resident incurs no expense. On the other hand, if a resident would like security lighting pointing toward their home, CPS offers night security lighting at a cost to the homeowner.

The COSA notes the following: "There are several sources for personal home security lighting. CPS Energy can provide, install, and maintain such a light.
