- Road construction on Eisenhower is expected to finish by late March, hopefully.

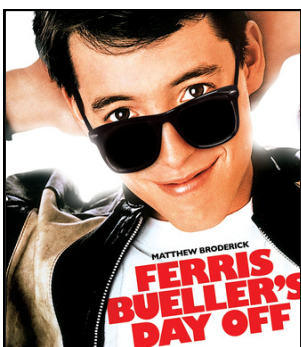


Farewell to the Letter Carrier

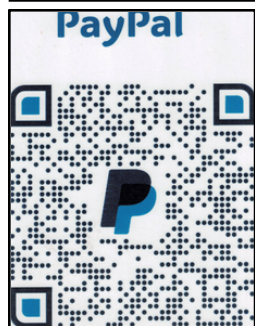

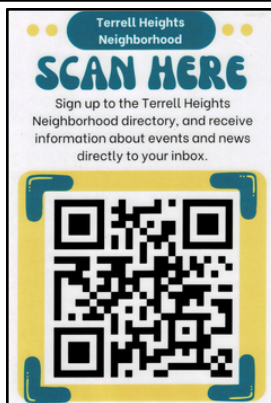
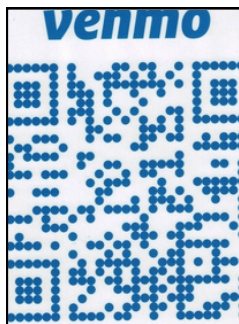

Mayor & City Council Election

The mayor and city council election is almost upon us, and with the new term limits set fourth by Proposition F in full force, Mayor Ron Nurinberg is ineligible to run for re-election. This marks the first time since 2009 that San Antonio will not have a sitting mayor on the ballot. As a result, a staggering 27 new candidates have entered the race, all vying for the the title of Mayor. However, with the unprecedented amount of hopefuls, securing the 50% of votes needed to win may

prove challenging. If no candidate reaches that threshold, a run-off election will be held on June 7th. Also in this election, voters will cast their ballots for city council. Unlike the mayoral race, our very own District 10 has only five candidates: Roy Anthony II, Clint W Norton, Mark Duane O'Donnell, Eric Litaker and the sitting incumbent, Marc Whyte. Election day is set for Saturday, May 3, 2025; polls will be open from 7 am to 7 pm.
